COURSE OBJECTIVES:

These courses are designed for European teachers of English at Secondary level (ages 11 – 18).

Participants will have the opportunity:

- to acquire new skills & ideas for using the computer to teach English
- to gain a huge variety of teaching ideas & motivating materials ready to use in the classroom
- to exchange ideas and develop links with teachers from secondary schools in different European countries

COURSE CONTENT:

- 1. Workshops: Using New Technology for Teaching English** (4 days)
with expert TEFL trainer, Graham Workman. The workshop will include:
 - everything you ever wanted to know about how to use the computer for language teaching
 - all the basic computer language you need to work with your computer for lesson preparation
 - guidance and practice using your computer to design lesson materials
 - the production of lesson materials for your learners
 - recommended website resources for teaching your subject
 - the creation of free website learning areas for all your classes
 - practice using your computer to mark written work and provide feedback
 - ideas for motivating learners through computer-based activities which engage their imaginations and creativity (from the European 'Lingua' Project 'Staging Foreign Language Learning')
- As the course will involve working with online materials in order to adapt them for lessons with your learners, it is recommended that, if possible, you bring your laptop for use when accessing and working on materials in the practical workshop sessions.
- By the end of the course, you will go away with everything you need to know about using the computer for your teaching purposes as well as materials you have worked on and produced for your classes.
- 2. Lecture & Discussion: The Education System & The Place of New Technologies** in teaching Modern Foreign Languages & other subjects in British Secondary schools
- 3. Educational visit** to The Constable Country from Ipswich
or Welsh Open Air Museum & St Fagans Castle from Cardiff
- 4. Day visits to two secondary Schools** with an opportunity to observe lessons (2 week courses only)
- 5. Lecture: Multicultural Britain** (Ipswich 2 week course only)
- 6. Lecture & Discussion on the teaching of Modern Languages** (Ipswich 2 week course only)
- 7. Workshop on Dylan Thomas's Poetry** (Cardiff 2 week course only)
- 8. Visit National Museum & Gallery, Cardiff with talk on Welsh History** (Cardiff 2 week course only)

LOCATIONS:

IPSWICH, England: Population: 120,000; 90 miles (144 kilometres) north-east of London (1¼ hours by rail).

Ipswich, the county town of Suffolk, is situated close to the unspoilt Suffolk coast and to many picturesque villages. It has an attractive waterfront and some noteworthy historic buildings, including a fine Tudor mansion.

The most convenient airport: Stansted (direct National Express coach to Ipswich) or other London airports (rail/coach via Central London to Ipswich)

CARDIFF, Wales: Population: 330,000; 150 miles (240 kilometres) from London (2¼ hours by rail).

Cardiff, the capital city of Wales, situated on the south coast of Wales, is a lively cultural centre. Its attractions include: Cardiff Bay, Cardiff Castle, National Museum and Gallery and Llandaff Cathedral. Nearby are the Open-Air Museum of Welsh Life, Caerphilly Castle, the Brecon Beacons National Park and beautiful coastal scenery and beaches.

The most convenient airports: Cardiff (rail or bus to city centre), Heathrow (direct National Express coach to Cardiff) or Bristol (airport bus then rail to Cardiff)

TRAVEL:

Transport at the beginning and end of the course is not provided and International Study Programmes regrets that it is unable to assist with travel arrangements. Please check the most convenient airports above. If arriving at other airports, travel to the course location is generally via central London by coach or rail.

 comprises:

(a) **COURSE FEE** (as detailed on Page 1) to include:

Full programme of study sessions and visits as itemized above.

NB. Participants are responsible for paying their own daily transport costs including transport to secondary schools. Optional visits are not included in the price.

(b) **HOST FAMILY ACCOMMODATION** (as detailed on Page 1) to include:

Full board accommodation with a local family (inclusive of registration fee): 8 or 12 nights
(Teachers may request to be the only guest of their mother tongue or to stay in the same family as a colleague).

Host families are carefully selected and offer a friendly welcome and opportunities to chat and learn more about life in Britain today. Participants often find that the experience of staying with a host family is one of the most memorable aspects of the course. Accommodation is in single rooms (unless participants request to share). Breakfast, packed lunch and evening meal are provided by the host family. (Food allergies, likes and dislikes are taken into account.)

Please note that many of the suitable residential areas are not within walking distance of the town centre, and most host families are an easy bus ride from the town centre/tuition centre. Local transport from host families to the town centre is at the participants' own expense and is likely to cost 15-30 Euro per week.

Additional nights with host families can be arranged, giving participants extra time for individual research and visits. Accommodation can be provided for family members (but not unaccompanied children) subject to availability. (Rates on request).

PAYMENT:

Full payment will be due 2 months before the course begins, or for teachers awaiting Comenius funding – as soon as the Comenius grant is received. Cancellation charges apply for cancellations 4 weeks or less before the course commences. 3-4 weeks before arrival: cancellation fee: 380 Euros. No refund for cancellations within 3 weeks of arrival. Cancellation insurance can be arranged through Endsleigh Insurance.

PREPARATION: Participants complete a detailed questionnaire before the course starts to ascertain their level of experience and training, as well as the age groups and types of learners they teach. Suggestions for pre-course reading are given.

EVALUATION: At the end of the course teachers participate in a detailed evaluation of the course.

FOLLOW UP: At the end of the course teachers are asked to consider which aspects of the course will be the most relevant to their own teaching situations. On their return they are invited to keep a record of how they have been able to utilise ideas gained on the course in their own classrooms. They are encouraged to share their experiences with their fellow participants by email. Teachers will also have email access to the teacher trainers for discussion and advice after the course.
