COURSE OBJECTIVES:

This course aims to provide:

- an opportunity for educators of different European nationalities to exchange experiences

COURSE CONTENT:

LOCATION:

DUNFERMLINE, Scotland: Population: 56,000; 16 miles (25 kilometres) north of Edinburgh.

Dunfermline, the ancient capital of Scotland, boasts a famous medieval abbey, palace ruins, interesting museums and a lovely park. It lies on the northern side of the Firth of Forth, at the southern gateway to the Scottish Highlands, and is ideally placed for visits to Edinburgh and to some of the most beautiful scenery of Scotland.

TOTAL PRICE: 1447 Euro comprising:

(a) COURSE FEE to include:

Full programme of study sessions and visits as itemised above.

NB. Participants are responsible for paying their own daily transport costs, including visits to schools. Any optional visits are not included in the price.

(b) HOST FAMILY ACCOMMODATION to include:

Full board accommodation with a local family (inclusive of registration fee): 7 nights

(Teachers may request to be the only guest of their mother tongue or to stay in the same family as a colleague).

Host families are carefully selected and offer a friendly welcome and opportunities to chat and learn more about life in Britain today. Participants often find that the experience of staying with a host family is one of the most memorable aspects of the course. Accommodation is in single rooms (unless participants request to share). Breakfast, packed lunch and evening meal are provided by the host family. (Food allergies, likes and dislikes are taken into account.)

Please note that many of the suitable residential areas are not within walking distance of the town centre, and most host families are an easy bus ride from the town centre/tuition centre. Local transport from host families to the town centre and local schools is at the participants' own expense and is likely to cost 15-30 Euro per week.

Additional nights with host families can be arranged, giving participants extra time for individual research and visits. Accommodation can be provided for family members (but not unaccompanied children) subject to availability. (Rates on request).

Alternatively

Hotel accommodation -in central location - Bed & Breakfast only (single rooms ensuite) is available.

Total fee including course + hotel accommodation: 1734 Euro.

PAYMENT:

Full payment will be due 2 months before the course begins, or for teachers awaiting funding – as soon as the grant is received.

Cancellation charges apply for cancellations 4 weeks or less before the course commences. 3-4 weeks before arrival: cancellation fee: 380 Euros.

No refund for cancellations within 3 weeks of arrival. Applicants are strongly advised to take out cancellation insurance.

PREPARATION: Participants complete a detailed questionnaire before the course starts to indicate their background and particular interests. Participants are asked to come prepared to discuss School Improvement & Quality Evaluation in their own country with participants of other European nationalities.

OUTCOMES: By the end of the course participants will have gained a deeper knowledge of issues concerning School Improvement and Quality Evaluation in Scotland (and various other European Countries), which will hopefully inform and enrich their own work in this field.

EVALUATION: At the end of the course educators participate in a detailed evaluation of the course.

FOLLOW UP: At the end of the course participants are asked to consider which aspects are most relevant to their own situation, They are encouraged to remain in email contact with fellow participants.

TRAVEL:

Transport at the beginning and end of the course is not provided and International Study Programmes regrets that it is unable to assist with travel arrangements.

The most convenient airport is Edinburgh (direct Stagecoach 747 bus to Dunfermline). If arriving at other airports, travel to the course location is generally via central London by coach or rail.
