1 & 2 WEEK COURSES FOR EUROPEAN TEACHERS OF ENGLISH FOCUSING ON LITERATURE

This course is designed to give teachers of English the opportunity to update their knowledge of contemporary literature and provide them with fresh ideas and techniques for teaching English literature and for using poetry, stories and drama in their English language classes.

CHELTENHAM FESTIVAL OF LITERATURE

THE COURSE WILL TAKE PLACE DURING THE CHELTENHAM FESTIVAL OF LITERATURE, AN IMPORTANT ANNUAL NATIONAL FESTIVAL, INVOLVING PROMINENT CONTEMPORARY BRITISH WRITERS.

The 2017 Festival events have not yet been finalised. However, Festival events span theatrical performances, poetry readings, literary debates and discussions, interviews with and presentations by famous novelists, poets and dramatists (eg in recent festivals: Martin Amis, Edna O'Brien, Rose Tremain, Ian McEwan, David Hare, Sebastian Faulkes, etc). Emphasis is mainly, but not entirely, on modern literature. (There is normally a 'Shakespeare Lecture' by a prominent Shakespearean actor). Non-fiction topics, such as politics, history, science and gardens, also feature.

COURSE CONTENT:

The course will comprise the following elements:

1. Attendance at least 6 events of the Cheltenham Festival of Literature (mainly contemporary English literature).

(There will also be plenty of opportunities for participants to attend further events of their own choice at their own expense. Most events last one hour and cost between £6 and £15. Full details of the 2017 Festival will be available in August 2017).

- 2. A one day Methodology Session with a trainer of British teachers of English Literature on:
 - Introducing Aspects of Life in Modern Britain through Literary Texts
 - Techniques for Teaching English Literature (contemporary theatre, prose and poetry)
 - Texts used for Teaching Literature in British Schools including Literature for Teenagers
 - Opportunity for participants to exchange ideas on authors featured in the festival and on teaching literature
- 3. A two day Methodology Seminar: 'Teaching Literature in the EFL Classroom' by a prominent EFL teacher trainer. Participants are introduced to a variety of approaches and techniques for dealing with different literary genres (novels, short stories, poems, etc). They are provided with extensive bibliographical and internet support as well as practical ideas and teaching materials which they can use with their classes. The use of film and literary extracts on DVD is incorporated into the programme.
- 4. **Two day visits to secondary schools** including observation of English literature and modern language classes and opportunities for discussion with teachers and pupils. (2 week course only).
- 5. **Workshop on Teaching English as a Foreign Language** conducted by expert teacher trainers with many years experience in training European teachers of English and a wealth of ideas to impart. (2 days on 2 week course, 1 day on week course).

A wide range of teaching ideas and activities designed to make language lessons more enjoyable and worthwhile will be discussed and shared. Emphasis will be on motivating pupils through a variety of activities which engage their imaginations & creativity - innovative role play & drama activities, use of the media, poetry and stories. The workshop will include: Recent Developments in the English Language and Advanced Language Practice, giving teachers the opportunity to polish their own language skills.

- 6. A workshop on Shakespeare's Theatre
- 7. An educational visit to Stratford-upon-Avon

LOCATION:

CHELTENHAM: Population: 108,000; 98 miles (157 kilometres) west of London (2 hours by rail, 2½ hours by coach). Cheltenham is an elegant spa town, situated on the edge of the Cotswold Hills, which are famous for their picturesque stone villages. Cheltenham is known for its Regency architecture, wide tree-lined streets, parks and gardens and it has many attractive residential areas.

TOTAL PRICE: (as detailed on Page 1) comprises:

(a) Course Fee: to include:

Full programme of study sessions and visits, and Literature Festival events as itemised above

NB. Participants are responsible for paying their own daily transport costs, including transport to secondary schools.

Optional excursions are not included in the price.

(b) Host Family Accommodation: to include:

Full board accommodation with a local family (inclusive of registration fee): 14 nights or 9 nights (Teachers may request to be the only quest of their mother tongue or to stay in the same family as a colleague).

Host families are carefully selected and offer a friendly welcome and opportunities to chat and learn more about life in Britain today. Participants often find that the experience of staying with a host family is one of the most memorable aspects of the course. Accommodation is in single rooms (unless participants request to share). Breakfast, packed lunch and evening meal are provided by the host family. (Food allergies, likes and dislikes are taken into account.)

Please note that many of the suitable residential areas are not within walking distance of the town centre, and most host families are an easy bus ride from the town centre/tuition centre. Local transport from host families to the town centre and local schools is at the participants' own expense and is likely to cost 15-30 Euro per week.

Additional nights with host families can be arranged, giving participants extra time for individual research and visits. Accommodation can be provided for family members (but not unaccompanied children) subject to availability. (Rates on request).

PAYMENT:

Full payment will be due 2 months before the course begins, or for teachers awaiting funding – as soon as the grant is received.

Cancellation charges apply for cancellations 4 weeks or less before the course commences. 3-4 weeks before arrival: cancellation fee: 380 Euros.

No refund for cancellations within 3 weeks of arrival. Applicants are strongly advised to take out cancellation insurance.

TRAVEL:

Transport at the beginning and end of the course is not provided and International Study Programmes regrets that it is unable to assist with travel arrangements. The most convenient airports: Heathrow (direct National Express Coach to Cheltenham), Birmingham (rail to Cheltenham) or Bristol (airport bus then rail to Cheltenham).
