COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Teachers of all foreign or second languages (not only English) to primary, secondary or adult learners are invited to attend this course. Participants will have the opportunity:

- to acquire new skills & ideas for teaching languages using mobile technologies
- to gain an insight into the use of technology in British schools
- to exchange ideas and develop links with teachers from schools in different European countries

COURSE CONTENT:

1. Mobile Pedagogy for language teachers – practical, creative 21st century learning experiences using mobile technologies with expert trainers such as Lucy Norris

- Rethinking pedagogy – Learning foreign & second languages in the 21st century
- Mobile learning & learner mobilities – mobile assisted language learning for academic & professional development (for teachers and their learners)
- Digital Literacies for language teachers & learners – what these are & how to grow your own
- Designing & creating effective multimedia learning tasks
- Using and evaluating educational & creative apps
- Staying safe online - privacy, data & what you need to know to protect yourself, your school & your learners
- Playing as learning - Virtual & Augmented Reality apps to enrich language
- Digital, Multimedia Storytelling - the power of narrative to engage language learners
- How to create a 'flipped learning' approach for your learners
- How to use mobile devices to reflect on, assess & contribute to learner progress
- How to create your own personal learning network via social media
- Creativity and Making – crucial ideas for effective language learning & teaching
- Overcoming challenges using a BYOD (Bring your own Device) approach

Participants will need at least level B1 English to benefit from the course.

You will need to bring your own tablet & smartphone, but need not have any previous experience of using them in your teaching.

You will gain practical skills in the creative design of mobile language learning tasks and you will build up an e-portfolio of materials you create with other participants.

2. Lecture & Discussion: The Education System & The Place of New Technologies

3. Day visits to 3 primary or secondary schools or adult education colleges (2 week course only)

Observe lessons where technology is in use in the classroom and lessons in the subject(s) requested by each participant.

LOCATIONS:

CAMBRIDGE, England: Population: 124,000, 63 miles (100 kilometres) north of London (1 hour by rail).

Cambridge is a beautiful historic city, world famous for its prestigious university with its magnificent ancient colleges and lovely riverside. It has picturesque shopping streets, fascinating museums and attractive parks.

The most convenient airports for Cambridge are Stansted & Luton, which have direct bus links to Cambridge. If arriving at other airports, travel is via central London.

EXETER, England: Population: 105,000; 190 miles (305 kilometres) south-west of London (2½ hours by rail).

Exeter is an historic city with a magnificent Gothic cathedral, many lovely old buildings and a variety of interesting museums. It is the county town of Devon, situated in beautiful hilly countryside, close to the South Devon coast and Dartmoor National Park.

The most convenient airports: Exeter (bus to city centre), Bristol (airport bus then rail or coach to Exeter) or Heathrow (direct National Express Coach to Exeter)

SOUTHAMPTON, England: Population: 220,000; 80 miles (128 kilometres) south-west of London (1¼ hours by rail).

Southampton is a pleasant university town and an important port situated on the south coast, within easy reach of the New Forest, Winchester, Salisbury, Portsmouth, Bournemouth and the Isle of Wight. There is an historic old town, interesting museums, a new waterside development and an excellent shopping centre.

The most convenient airports: Southampton (rail to city centre), Heathrow (direct National Express coach to Southampton) or Gatwick (direct coach or rail to Southampton)

TOTAL PRICE (as detailed on Page 1) comprises:

(a) **COURSE FEE:** to include:

Full programme of study sessions and visits as itemised above.

NB. Participants are responsible for paying their own daily transport costs, including transport to schools.

Optional visits are not included in the price.

(b) **HOST FAMILY ACCOMMODATION:** to include:

Full board accommodation with a local family (inclusive of registration fee): 8 or 12 nights

(Teachers may request to be the only guest of their mother tongue or to stay in the same family as a colleague).

Host families are carefully selected and offer a friendly welcome and opportunities to chat and learn more about life in Britain today.

Participants often find that the experience of staying with a host family is one of the most memorable aspects of the course. Accommodation is in single rooms (unless participants request to share). Breakfast, packed lunch and evening meal are provided by the host family. (Food allergies, likes and dislikes are taken into account.)

Please note that many of the suitable residential areas are not within walking distance of the town centre, and most host families are an easy bus ride from the town centre/tuition centre. Local transport from host families to the town centre and local schools is at the participants' own expense and is likely to cost 15-30 Euro per week.

Additional nights with host families can be arranged, giving participants extra time for individual research and visits. Accommodation can be provided for family members (but not unaccompanied children) subject to availability. (Rates on request).

Participants wishing to arrange their own (hotel or self-catering) accommodation may pay a fee for the course only.

PAYMENT:

Full payment will be due 2 months before the course begins, or for teachers awaiting funding – as soon as the grant is received.

Cancellation charges apply for cancellations 4 weeks or less before the course commences. 3-4 weeks before arrival: cancellation fee: 380 Euros.

No refund for cancellations within 3 weeks of arrival. Applicants are strongly advised to take out cancellation insurance.

TRAVEL:

Transport at the beginning and end of the course is not provided and International Study Programmes regrets that it is unable to assist with travel arrangements.

The most convenient airports: Cardiff Airport (rail or bus to city centre), Heathrow or Bristol Airports (direct National Express coach from both to Cardiff).

If arriving at other airports, travel to the course location is generally via central London by coach or rail.

PREPARATION: Participants complete a detailed questionnaire before the course starts to ascertain their level of experience and training, as well as the age groups and types of learners they teach. Suggestions for pre-course reading are given.

EVALUATION: At the end of the course teachers participate in a detailed evaluation of the course.

FOLLOW UP: At the end of the course teachers are asked to consider which aspects of the course will be the most relevant to their own teaching situations. On their return they are invited to keep a record of how they have been able to utilise ideas gained on the course in their own classrooms. They are encouraged to share their experiences with their fellow participants by email. Teachers will also have email access to the teacher trainers for discussion and advice after the course.
