#### ***COURSE OBJECTIVES:***

The course aims to provide teachers with:

- techniques and ideas for teaching drama and theatre studies
- ideas for using drama & other creative activities to teach English
- an opportunity to exchange ideas and develop links with teachers from other European countries
- an insight into the teaching of drama in British schools

#### ***COURSE CONTENT:***

1. **Drama in the secondary classroom** - Practical workshops with emphasis on active participation. A variety of techniques will be introduced. The workshops will provide teachers with various methodologies for teaching drama and theatre studies. Process Drama and Verbatim Theatre will be included. Teachers will consider the use of drama in helping pupils to gain self-confidence, speech flow, and concentration. They will also consider the use of improvisation and playback theatre to encourage self expression, creativity, problem solving and other thinking skills.
2. **Workshop on drama activities for school pupils** at Nuffield Theatre, Southampton.
3. **Workshop: Drama Activities for Teaching English as a Foreign Language:** Motivating pupils through a variety of activities which engage their imaginations and creativity - innovative role play and drama activities, use of the media, poetry and stories (1 day).
4. **Theatre Studies** - a workshop on innovative ideas for teaching the works of major European playwrights, using Shakespeare's Theatre as an example
5. **Attend a Shakespeare play** at Shakespeare's Globe Theatre in London and visit London.
6. **Attend a play** at Chichester Festival Theatre and visit Chichester.
7. **Lecture & Discussion on the Teaching of Drama in British Schools**
8. **1 or 2 day visits to Secondary schools.** Observe lessons including drama/ theatre studies and discussion with staff.
9. **Observation of Youth Theatre workshops/ rehearsals/ performances.**
10. **Opportunity to exchange experiences with participants from other countries**
11. **Cultural visit:** Winchester

#### ***LOCATION:***

**SOUTHAMPTON, England:** Population: 220,000; 80 miles (128 kilometres) south-west of London (1¼ hours by rail). Southampton is a pleasant university town and an important port situated on the south coast, within easy reach of the New Forest, Winchester, Salisbury, Portsmouth, Bournemouth and the Isle of Wight. There is an historic old town with interesting museums, a new waterside development and an excellent shopping centre.

**TOTAL PRICE** (as detailed on Page 1) comprises:

(a) **COURSE FEE:** to include:

Full programme of study sessions and visits as itemised above.  
NB. Participants are responsible for paying their own daily transport costs.  
Optional visits are not included in the price.

(b) **HOST FAMILY ACCOMMODATION:** to include:

Full board accommodation with a local family (inclusive of registration fee): 13 nights or 8 nights  
(Teachers may request to be the only guest of their mother tongue or to stay in the same family as a colleague).

Host families are carefully selected and offer a friendly welcome and opportunities to chat and learn more about life in Britain today. Participants often find that the experience of staying with a host family is one of the most memorable aspects of the course. Accommodation is in single rooms (unless participants request to share). Breakfast, packed lunch and evening meal are provided by the host family. (Food allergies, likes and dislikes are taken into account.)

Please note that many of the suitable residential areas are not within walking distance of the town centre, and most host families are an easy bus ride from the town centre/tuition centre. Local transport from host families to the town centre and local schools is at the participants' own expense and is likely to cost 15-30 Euro per week.

Additional nights with host families can be arranged, giving participants extra time for individual research and visits. Accommodation can be provided for family members (but not unaccompanied children) subject to availability. (Rates on request).

Participants wishing to arrange their own (hotel or self-catering) accommodation may pay a fee for the course only.

### **PAYMENT:**

Full payment will be due 2 months before the course begins, or for teachers awaiting funding – as soon as the grant is received.  
Cancellation charges apply for cancellations 4 weeks or less before the course commences. 3-4 weeks before arrival: cancellation fee: 380 Euros.  
No refund for cancellations within 3 weeks of arrival. Applicants are strongly advised to take out cancellation insurance.

### **TRAVEL:**

Transport at the beginning and end of the course is not provided and International Study Programmes regrets that it is unable to assist with travel arrangements.  
The most convenient airports: Southampton (rail to city centre), Heathrow (direct National Express coach to Southampton) or Gatwick (direct coach or rail to Southampton). If arriving at other airports, travel to the course location is generally via central London by coach or rail.

The annual Erasmus+ deadline is 2 February 2017 for courses starting 1 June 2017 – 31 December 2018, and in February 2018 for courses starting 1 June 2018 – 31 December 2019.

Schools should first register on-line to obtain a Personal Identification Code (PIC) number for the school.

Applications for funding should then be made on-line to applicants' National Agency for Erasmus+.
